Draft Concept

The second Hayek-Trip leads the participants to the politically and economically most important country on the African continent. The trip focuses on giving the participants a comprehensive overview on the political, economic and social challenges South Africa is facing. This involves the following topics:

- South Africa's role as the leading economy in Africa
- Transformation and Transition from Apartheid to Democracy
- Good governance and sustainable development

Furthermore, a focus will lie on the question how to address the urging social problems with civil society solutions. The participants are going to visit several projects that on a private basis are engaged in poverty fighting and migration. As South Africa is one of the most world's important destination for refugees from Africa the latter is of particular importance for the EU. In the aftermath, participants will issue a publication for the FNF focusing on liberal civil society solutions for social problems.

Above all, the tour is particularly aiming at connecting future leaders from Germany and South Africa. Different solutions from different continents shall be discussed and evaluated. For that reason, the FNF's partners shall take part in several of the planned events and tours.
